Clinic with a Heart is held the first four Tuesdays and Thursdays at the Clinic's new location at 1701 S. 17th St. There will be no clinic on major holidays.

All clinics are free, walk-in (no appointments). Patients are seen on a first-come, first-served basis. Patients under the age of 19 must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian. Clinics run from 5:30-7:00 p.m. Services provided include medical, dental, physical therapy, mental health assessments, chiropractic and vision screenings and exams (see schedule of services below).

The Clinic is a Walk-in Clinic. No appointments are made in advance.

Provides affordable, comprehensive primary health care especially for those with limited resources. Co-Pay is \$20 minimum.

If you cannot pay the co-pay you must tell them and explain your situation. They will bill you for the **minimum medical co-payment of \$20**.

Screening tests help find precancerous growths (called polyps) so they can be removed before they turn into cancer. If you're over the age of 50, you are at increased risk for colon cancer. Any man or woman, over 50 years of age and older and who meet income guidelines, is eligible to fill out the Nebraska Colon Cancer Screening Enrollment Form. Call for details and an appointment. To meet the requirements of the program you need to be NOT covered by any medical prescription plan and your income needs to be \$19,000 or lower for a single individual and no more than \$25,000 for a couple.

Your medications need to be for a chronic or ongoing illness since once accepted you are enrolled for a year at a time. It is best if your medication dosage is stable. Not all medications are covered by the National Pharmaceutical Assistance program. An \$8 first-time fee is charged to cover postage and handling but can be waived depending on individual circumstances.

Drug Assistance Programs

Many pharmaceutical companies offer patient assistance programs to provide prescription medicines free of charge to physicians whose patients might not otherwise have access to necessary medicines. Each company determines the eligibility criteria for its program. Eligibility criteria and application process varies. Criteria are based on the patient's insurance status and/or income level; some may also have residency requirements.

Drug assistance program called “Lilly Answers Card.” The card is available without cost. Seniors on Medicare pay a flat \$12 fee for a 30 day supply of any drug distributed by Lilly. Savings can average \$52 per 30-day prescription. Eligibility guideline is U.S. citizen, Medicare enrolled seniors and persons with disabilities, no other prescription drug coverage. Annual income no more than \$18,000 for single person (\$1,500 monthly) or no more than \$24,000 for a couple (\$2,000 monthly).

The Nebraska Comprehensive Health Insurance Pool (NECHIP) provides health insurance to Nebraska residents who are unable to obtain it at an affordable price or without restrictions because of a medical condition. Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Nebraska administers the plan. **This is not free health care coverage.** The program is designed for those who have been turned down for regular insurance due to medical reasons, can only get limited health care coverage elsewhere, or have only been offered health insurance that has a premium higher than what is available through NECHIP. KIDS CONNECTION

Kids Connection is Nebraska's Medicaid Managed Care health insurance program for children. Nebraska Health Connection/Kids Connection will provide all the medical services you need. You'll have one doctor, your Primary Care Physician (PCP), who will coordinate all your health care needs.

If you are covered under a mandated eligibility category (including Aid for Dependent Children, Medical Assistance for Children, Aid to the Aged, Blind and Disabled, or State Wards), by law, you must enroll in Nebraska Health Connection/Kids Connection. *If you choose not to select your doctor and health plan, they will be chosen for you.*

What's covered under Kids Connection? You'll receive the same basic benefits as regular Medicaid. Everything covered under regular Medicaid is covered under Nebraska Health Connection/Kids Connection. There is no premium or co-pay for Kids Connection. Families at or below 200% of poverty level are eligible.

How do I enroll my children in Kids Connection?
